Our goal is to make sure that you have the right coverage you need for your upcoming trip. Based on your age and travel details, Allianz Global Assistance, the travel insurance provider, requires a medical screening in order to offer a quote.

This helpful reference document outlines the health questions you will be asked. Please review, then contact your insurance advisor to complete this medical screening with your travel insurance quote. Feel free to consult with your physician if you are unsure of how to answer these questions.

Medical screening health questions

The following medical screening questions are applicable to Canadian travellers age 65 and above. To qualify for coverage, you must meet the eligibility requirements applicable to the plan being quoted.

Key terms are in *italics* and defined in the definitions section below.

It is important to answer accurately so that you have coverage in the event of a claim. Any misrepresentation or nondisclosure may void your policy and leave you without coverage. Allianz Global Assistance may require access to your medical records to confirm your responses are accurate.

The following questions will require a Yes or No response

1. In the past 6 months have you been prescribed, refilled or taken prescription medication, other than birth control, low-dose aspirin, or antibiotics?

If you answer Yes, the following questions will come up

Specifically, in the past 6 months have you been prescribed, refilled or taken prescription medication for:

- a) Blood pressure?
- b) Stroke/mini-stroke (TIA), or prevention of a blood clot?
- c) A *heart condition*?
- d) A *digestive condition*?
- e) A *lung/respiratory condition* (excluding allergies)?
- f) Diabetes or pre-diabetes?

If your medication is not related to any of the conditions listed above, you would answer "No".

2. Have you been diagnosed with or had any cancer treatment in the past 6 months? (This does not include basal or squamous cell skin cancer or breast cancer treated only with hormone therapy.)
3. Have you used any tobacco or nicotine products in the past 6 months?

Definitions section

Heart Condition means any condition relating to the heart or cardiovascular system.

Digestive condition means any condition related to your esophagus, stomach and intestines.

Lung/respiratory Condition means any condition related to the lung or respiratory system.

If your health changes in any way before your trip, consult with your physician, then notify your insurance advisor to see how this may affect your coverage.
