Discovered in the 15th century, these islands quickly became essential stopovers for ships laden with treasures brought over from the Americas.

Today, under Portuguese autonomy, the Azores epitomize natural splendour. Volcanic peaks, quaint homesteads, and fishing hamlets dot the landscape, offering an escape into unspoiled nature. Our journey through São Miguel, Terceira, Faial, and Pico reveals the unique spirit of each isle. We will meander through vibrant harbourside plazas, across rolling pastures, and peer from belvederes into luminous crater lakes.

Over nine days, from the misty heights of mountains to the carefully tended vineyards, we will experience the multifaceted allure of the Azores.

#### SEP 12, Thursday DEPART CANADA

#### SEP 13, Friday TERCEIRA ISLAND

The name translating to "Third" in Portuguese, fittingly reflects its status as the third island discovered and the third largest. Upon our arrival, we will be greeted by our local guide and then proceed to Angra do Heroísmo, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This charming city offers a delightful glimpse into an era long past. Its snug harbour is protected by a volcanic cone and played a pivotal role from the 16th to 18th centuries. Ships laden with treasures from the Americas would stop here on their way to Europe, making it a major staging point for transatlantic trade. Our exploration will take us to the Public Gardens and the Convent of São Gonçalo, the oldest convent in Angra do Heroísmo. Here, we can delve into the beautiful Baroque church's interior, featuring a collection of 18th-century Portuguese tiles. Moving on, our next destination is the Cathedral of Angra do Heroísmo, where we can marvel at its unique Indo-Portuguese lectern, exquisite silverwork in the holy chapel, and a 16th-century wooden painting in the main chapel. As the day concludes, we will savour our welcome dinner at the hotel.

#### SEP 14, Saturday

#### TERCEIRA ISLAND

Drive to Monte Brasil for commanding views over the whole island and stop at Pico das Cruzinhas Belvedere for the most impressive vista over Angra do Heroísmo. In the island's centre, we visit Algar do Carvão, an ancient 100metre deep lava tube full of fascinating geology. On the east coast, observe typical settlements and traditional houses contrasting with lush green fields bordered by lava stone walls. One of the oldest on the islands, the parish church in São Sebastião contains exquisite frescoes. Nearby is an "Império", a small chapel characteristic of the Azorean towns. These Impérios play a central role in the popular Holy Ghost religious festivals, a medieval tradition rarely seen elsewhere in Europe. After lunch in a typical local restaurant, we drive to Praia da Vitória and then to Serra do Cume, taking in pastoral scenes overlooking Lajes and the ocean. Pass by the area where wild bulls are used in Terceira's bullfights (Touradas) before reaching Biscoitos, where we will admire the natural lava swimming pools and visit a local winery.

#### SEP 15, Sunday TERCEIRA / FAIAL ISLAND

Early this morning we will catch a quick 40 minute flight to Faial Island. We will explore Horta on foot, this small city that was one of the most important harbours in the early days of settlement. Afterwards we will enjoy lunch at a local restaurant. The remainder of the day is at leisure.

#### SEP 16, Monday

#### **FAIAL ISLAND**

From the breathtaking vantage of Espalamaca Belvedere, we take in captivating views of Horta, its lively harbour, and the surrounding landscapes. We continue upwards to Faial Island's highest point—the Caldeira, a large crater brimming with gorgeous scenery and rare flora. Our next stop is Capelinhos, where an underwater eruption during 1957-1958 formed new land, expanding Faial's size by about 2.4 square kilometers. Here we witness the islands' continuing evolution and visit the Interactive Centre detailing Capelinhos Volcano's history. For lunch, we pause at Varaduro, a delightful spa and summer resort famed for its distinctive natural swimming pools.

#### SEP 17, Tuesday

#### **PICO ISLAND**

We depart Horta on a ferry bound for Pico Island. Upon arriving in Madalena, our tour commences around the rugged island terrain. At Arcos do Cachorro, the ocean crashes against an impressive rock formation, creating an exciting show of sound and colour. Moving on, we explore the Misterios area, characterized by black rock remnants from past volcanic eruptions. The journey continues through São Roque, along a scenic road that cuts across to the island's southern side. Here, we are surrounded by native greenery, including Azorean Juniper and Mahogany, along with Laurel Trees. After lunch en route, we will have the chance to visit the Whaler's Museum, offering a glimpse into the island's historical connection with whaling. Our tour concludes with a ferry ride back to Horta from Madalena.

# SEP 18, Wednesday FAIAL / SÃO MIGUEL ISLAND

After a relaxed beginning to the day, we take flight to São Miguel, the largest and most geographically diverse of the islands. Following lunch, our exploration begins on foot along Marginal Avenue. We pass the iconic "Portas da Cidade" (City Gates) before continuing to the city hall, past the gleaming statue of St. Michael Archangel, the island's

patron saint. From there we head to the Matriz Church and the Museum of Sacred Art nestled within the Church of the College. We will culminate our exploration at the convent da Esperança, home to the venerated Sanctuary of Santo Cristo dos Milagres.

#### SEP 19, Thursday THE EAST END

Today is a full day exploring the eastern side of the island. We journey along the southern coast to Vila Franca, the first capital of the island, and visit São Miguel Church, one of the oldest Gothic churches in the Azores. Continuing onward to Povoação, where early Portuguese navigators first landed, we make a stop at Ponta da Madrugada Belvedere, renowned as one of the island's most scenic overlooks, to take in the dramatic seascapes. Nordeste is a beautiful coastal village, noted for its lush vegetation, delightful gardens, and waterfalls. After lunch here, we continue along the north shore, passing several pleasant villages on the way.

#### SEP 20, Friday LAGOA DO FOGO / FURNAS

Venturing high into São Miguel's mountains, we will overlook the stunning Lagoa do Fogo (Fire Lake) — a sapphire volcanic lake whose name hints at its fiery origins. This serene crater lake encapsulates the island's mystical landscapes. As we cross one of the island's highest points. we will be treated to vistas of both the southern and northern coasts. In Ribeira Grande, the 17th and 18thcentury Baroque architecture will transport us back in time, before we return to the dramatic present-day coastline, sculpted by volcanic rock. Our visit to Gorreana, home to Europe's only commercially grown tea, reveals meticulously cultivated terraces. Heading back inland we make our way to the spa town of Furnas. Its town centre boasts over two dozen bubbling, steaming caldeiras (hot springs) that bubble up through the ground, which we will see firsthand in the nearby Valley of Furnas. We will stop to enjoy lunch at Casino Terra Nostra and stroll through the adjacent botanical gardens. Our day concludes in Ponta Delgada with a farewell dinner at a local restaurant featuring a folkloric show.

#### SEP 21, Saturday PONTA DELGADA / CANADA

Depart towards the westernmost part of the island, renowned for its scenic mountains and lakes. Revel in the coastal beauty adorned with green landscapes and charming cattle farms. Stop at the King's Vista overlooking the Blue and Green Lakes nestled within an enormous volcanic crater. As we return to Ponta Delgada, we take a mountain road along the island's northwest, stopping at Pico do Carvão to take in views of both coasts. On the outskirts of Ponta Delgada, visit local pineapple plantations and see how this tropical fruit is grown in greenhouses. There will be free time for lunch before our transfer to the airport for our direct flight back to Toronto, connecting us to various destinations across Canada.

CT Rating 3/5 - Moderately Challenging: This tour is designed as a leisurely, in-depth experience with two or three nights at most hotels. The journey includes extensive touring through the hilly islands. There will be opportunities for longer walks but these are optional for those interested. A number of walks are included which will involve hills, cobblestones and some steps. The islands themselves are quite hilly and this may affect those with limited mobility. All members need to be physically fit and able to meet our basic criteria to fully enjoy this journey.
