## Ports of Call

**SINGAPORE:** Located at the cross roads of Asia, this city-state is a magical blend of cultures, colonial heritage, natural wonders and towering skyscrapers. For centuries, traders from across the globe have used this huge safe port and today we find one of the most beautiful and modern cities in the world. The food scene runs the gamut from hawkers to Michelin stars, and merits a trip alone. Despite rapid development, nearly half the island is developed, leaving room for parks and open spaces such as the Bukit Timah Nature Reserve, where an old-growth forest still thrives.

**PUERTO PRINCESA, PHILIPPINES:** Established as a Spanish town in 1872, it became a crucial port during the era of Spanish colonization. Today, it is a renowned tourist destination due to its natural beauty and rich cultural heritage. Top attractions include the Immaculate Conception Cathedral, Palawan Heritage Center, and Palawan Butterfly Ecological Garden. However, its biggest draws are boat trips through the caves of the Puerto Princesa Subterranean River National Park and the beaches and islands scattered around scenic Honda Bay, making it perfect for snorkelling, sunbathing, and picnics.

**JAYAPURA, PAPUA, INDONESIA:** An out-of-the-way gem, Jayapura offers picturesque white-sand beaches, roadside stands where you can dine on coconuts and fresh, grilled fish, and fascinating World War II history to explore.

**RBAUL, PAPUA NEW GUINEA:** The East New Britain province of Papua New Guinea is lush and tropical. Mountain peaks and active volcanoes surround the town of Rabaul and Simpson Harbour. Built on an ancient volcanic crater, the harbour is one of the deepest in the region. For the same reason, some of the most spectacular diving and snorkelling in the world can be found here. At Sub-Base, a shallow reef extends dramatically out from shore before dropping off into a crevasse rich with fish and other marine life.

**KIRIWINA ISLAND, PAPUA NEW GUINEA:** The largest of the Trobriand Islands, it is home to a 12,000-strong indigenous population and is steeped in history, known for its WWII occupation. Various relics of the war, including the remains of an American plane, can still be seen on the island. Here, you will find an idyllic traditional lifestyle, incredibly friendly locals, and a fascinating social structure based on matrilineal clans. Many aspects of life revolve around the cultivation and exchange of yams. There is also mesmerizing scenery, from crystal-clear waters to jungle-covered cliffs. Hike to the burial caves, peruse exquisite carvings, and explore the coral-filled offshore islands. Be sure to stop and watch a game of Trobriand cricket, an innovative spin on the game.

**CONFLICT ISLANDS, PANAWAL GROUP, PAPUA NEW GUINEA:** This idyllic archipelago of 21 coral atolls off the coast of New Guinea is privately owned by a passionate conservationist. Activities are designed for the enjoyment of its beautiful beaches, coral reefs, and its clear, warm waters. Try kayaking, snorkelling or paddle-boarding, or simply relax on the shaded fringes of the lagoon. The area is likely to be a UNESCO World Heritage Site soon.

**CAIRNS, AUSTRALIA:** A gateway to the Great Barrier Reef and the tropical north of the country, Cairns is a laid-back city on the east coast of the Cape York Peninsula in northern Queensland. It's a popular launching pad for exploring the reef, the Daintree Rain Forest, and other attractions in the area. With friendly residents, fantastic beach life, and consistently sunny, warm weather, it's the perfect adventure starting point. To the east is the Great Barrier Reef, the world's longest coral reef, famously visible from space. The Kuranda Scenic Railway passes through UNESCO-listed rainforests to Kuranda village. An hour north, Port Douglas is known for its top-notch restaurants, art galleries, and boutiques.

**Shore Excursions** are not included in your cruise cost, allowing you to decide how you will use your time ashore.
