We will wander through colourful harbourside plazas, cross rolling pastures, and gaze from belvederes into luminous crater lakes. Over the course of ten days, you'll discover why these islands captivate travellers in search of something truly unique.

SEP 10, Thursday DEPART CANADA

Travellers from across Canada gather in Toronto for their flights to Terceira Island.

SEP 11, Friday TERCEIRA ISLAND

Terceira, whose name means "Third" in Portuguese, was the third island discovered and is the third largest. Upon arrival, we'll meet our local guide and proceed to Angra do Heroísmo, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This historic city, with its harbour sheltered by volcanic cliffs, served as a key hub for transatlantic trade from the 16th to 18th centuries. Our touring includes the Palace of the Captains General, the Public Gardens, and the Convent of São Gonçalo, the oldest in the city and renowned for its collection of 18th-century Portuguese tiles. We will also visit the Cathedral of Angra do Heroísmo, which features an Indo-Portuguese lectern, intricate silverwork, and a 16th-century wooden painting. The day concludes with a welcome dinner at the hotel. **Palacio Santa Catarina** (3 nights)

SEP 12, Saturday TERCEIRA ISLAND

Drive up to Monte Brasil and stop at Pico das Cruzinhas Belvedere for great views over Angra do Heroísmo. In the centre of the island, visit Algar do Carvão, a 100-metredeep volcanic cave with unique rock formations and an

underground lake. Along the east coast, we will pass through villages with colourful houses and green fields bordered by lava stone walls. Stop in São Sebastião to see the historic parish church's frescoes and an Império nearby-these small, bright chapels have hosted Holy Ghost festivals since medieval times. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant before heading to Praia da Vitória for a short stroll. Then drive through Serra do Cume, taking in panoramic views of Lajes and the ocean, before arriving in the wine region of Biscoitos to visit a wine museum.

SEP 13, Sunday **TERCEIRA**

Today offers a choice of two optional tours: venture out to sea to look for whales on their passage through the archipelago, or take an easy 6km coastal hike. Alternatively, you can simply unwind at the hotel and make use of the amenities. Please inform our sales specialists of your preferred activity when making your final payment. B

TERCEIRA / FAIAL ISLAND / PICO SEP 14, Monday

A short early morning flight takes us to Faial Island, where we'll stop at Espalamaca Belvedere for views of Horta's harbour. Next, we'll visit the Caldeira, a volcanic crater at the island's highest point, surrounded by dramatic scenery. At Capelinhos, we'll explore the landscape shaped by the 1957-1958 volcanic eruption and visit the underground Capelinhos Volcano Interpretation Centre to learn about the eruption, global volcanic activity, and the history of Azorean lighthouses. After lunch at Varadouro, a coastal retreat known for its natural volcanic swimming pools, we'll head to the harbour to catch a ferry to Pico Island, where we'll settle in for the next few nights.

SEP 15, Tuesday **PICO ISLAND**

Our day begins with a leisurely stroll through the village of Madalena. Just outside town, we'll visit the unique vineyards of Criação Velha, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Following some free time for lunch, we'll follow the southern coast to the Sanctuary of Bom Jesus in São Mateus. From there, we'll head to Lajes do Pico, the island's oldest village, where the Whalers' Museum offers a glimpse into Pico's deep connection with whaling. On the way back to the hotel, we'll stop at Lagoa do Capitão, a great spot for photos.

SEP 16, Wednesday

Today we journey along the island's north coast, with opportunities to experience local communities, including a visit to an interpretation centre to learn about the island's winemaking heritage. We'll stop at Mistério da Prainha, a local nature reserve formed during the Azores' longest recorded volcanic eruption (1562-1564). Our route back to the hotel takes us through the beautiful central plateau. BL

PICO / SÃO MIGUEL ISLAND SEP 17, Thursday

A morning flight brings us to São Miguel, the largest and most geographically diverse of the islands. We start our exploration on the western side, with Sete Cidades, which is renowned for its twin lakes and dramatic caldera. Along the way, take in coastal views, lush pastures, and charming cattle farms. Explore a pineapple plantation and learn about the cultivation process from planting to harvest. The day concludes in the spa town of Furnas. BLD

SEP 18, Friday THE EAST END

Moving east across São Miguel, we stop at Salto do Cavalo, followed by Ribeira dos Caldeirões Natural Park, known for its waterfall, 16th-century watermills, and hiking trails. Next, the most beautiful belvederes of Nordeste will amaze us: belvedere of Ponta do Sossego, belvedere of Ponta da Madrugada and the Belvedere of Ponta do Sol, where we will have a great view over Povoação. The tour continues to Povoação for lunch, then you can choose to join a hike around Furnas Lake (9.5 km / 3 hrs) or you may opt to visit Terra Nostra Garden (at your own expense, €18 per person) and relax in the thermal swimming pool.

SEP 19, Saturday LAGOA DO FOGO

Venturing high into São Miguel's mountains, we'll gaze upon the stunning Lagoa do Fogo (Fire Lake)—a sapphire-blue volcanic lake whose name hints at its fiery origins. This serene crater lake encapsulates the island's mystical landscapes. As we cross one of the island's highest points, we will be treated to vistas of both the southern and northern coasts. In Ribeira Grande, the 17th and 18th-century Baroque architecture will transport us back in time, before we return to the dramatic present-day coastline, sculpted by volcanic rock. Our visit to Gorreana, home to Europe's only commercial tea plantation, reveals meticulously cultivated terraces. Tonight we enjoy a farewell dinner and folklore show at Vale das Furnas Restaurant.

SEP 20, Sunday PONTA DELGADA / CANADA

Ponta Delgada is the largest city and the capital of the Azores. While the city continues to expand, its historic centre remains well-preserved, with whitewashed buildings accented by black basalt trim. Our walking tour begins at the City Gates, a symbol of Ponta Delgada. From there, we continue to City Hall to see the ornate statue of St. Michael the Archangel, the city's patron saint. We'll also visit the Matriz Church and the Museum of Sacred Art, housed in the former Jesuit College. The tour concludes at the Convento da Esperança and the Sanctuary of Senhor Santo Cristo dos Milagres, one of the most significant religious sites in the Azores. After some free time for lunch, we'll transfer to the airport for our direct flight to Toronto, with connections across Canada.

CT Rating 3/5 - Moderately Challenging: This tour is designed as a leisurely, in-depth experience with two or three nights at most hotels. There will be extensive touring across the islands with opportunities for longer walks but these are optional for those interested. A number of walks include navigating hills, cobblestones and some steps. The islands themselves are quite hilly and this may affect those with limited mobility. All members need to be physically fit and able to meet our basic criteria to fully enjoy this journey.
