Our Cruise Ship • Lord of the Glens

The Lord of the Glens is a bespoke, small luxury vessel designed specifically for cruising the waterways of Scotland, most notably the Caledonian Canal and the sheltered west coast. Carrying an intimate number of up to 50 guests in 25 cabins, it offers a unique, luxurious atmosphere.

Its design, inspired by the Royal Yacht Britannia, features an elegant, deep blue hull and a classical, warm interior. Guests are greeted by rich mahogany finishes, fine fabrics, and Highland artwork, creating the ambiance of a stately country manor.

Purpose-built for the narrow locks and canals, the Lord of the Glens can traverse routes inaccessible to larger ships. Onboard, facilities include the picture-windowed Robert Louis Stevenson restaurant, two comfortable lounges, a bar, and open Sun Decks perfect for viewing the spectacular Scottish scenery. With gourmet cuisine emphasizing local Scottish produce, and an exceptional

crew, the ship provides a highly distinctive and personalized voyage through the heart of the Highlands.



OCT 3, Saturday DEPART CANADA Gather in Toronto for our direct flight to Edinburgh.

OCT 4, Sunday ARRIVE EDINBURGH / PITLOCHRY

Our Scottish adventure begins upon arrival at Edinburgh Airport, where we meet our dedicated guide and coach. From there, we journey into the heart of the country for a welcome lunch at Loch Leven's Larder, a family-run farm shop offering impressive views over the loch. After lunch, step into Scotland's regal past at Scone Palace, the legendary crowning place of Scottish kings such as Macbeth and Robert the Bruce. Explore its opulent halls, view the site that once held the famed Stone of Destiny, and stroll through the beautifully landscaped gardens. If we're lucky, we might even catch a glimpse of the resident albino peacock. As the day winds down, we continue to Pitlochry, a picturesque Victorian town nestled in the Perthshire Highlands, where we'll check into our hotel and gather for dinner. **Westlands of Pitlochry** (1 night) LD

OCT 5, Monday INVERNESS / EMBARKATION

This morning, step into Blair Castle, ancestral home of the Atholl family, for over 700 years. Wander through magnificent rooms, from the weapons-filled Entrance Hall to the historic Tapestry Room, showcasing intricate wall hangings. If time allows, explore the grounds, from the walled Hercules Garden to the towering trees of Diana's Grove. Next, traverse the breathtaking Cairngorms National Park, pausing for lunch at The Rothiemurchus Centre. Here, a ranger introduces us to the region's famous Highland cattle on a Hairy Coo Safari, set against the stunning Spey Valley. End the day by boarding your ship at Invergordon Port, where cabins await and the welcome reception and dinner set the tone for the journey aboard the **Lord of the Glens** (6 nights).

OCT 6, Tuesday INVERNESS / FORT AUGUSTUS
Feel history come alive this morning at Culloden, the infamous battlefield where Bonnie Prince Charlie's Jacobite forces met their final defeat in 1746. Nearby, the ancient stones of Clava Cairns whisper secrets from a much earlier time. From there, we trade land for water, setting sail along the famous Caledonian Canal, an engineering marvel carved through the Great Glen in the early 1800s. Our cruise glides into the legendary waters of Loch Ness, where the ruins of Urquhart Castle rise dramatically on its shore. As the day unfolds, we ascend a series of locks into the charming village of Fort Augustus, a place rich in history and Highland spirit, where we will rest for the night.

FORT AUGUSTUS / CORPACH OCT 7, Wednesday We sail into Loch Oich, the highest point of the canal, embraced by tranquil Highland scenery, before drifting through the tree-lined splendour of Laggan Avenue often hailed as one of the most picturesque stretches of the journey. From there, we cross Loch Lochy and continue on to Banavie, where Ben Nevis towers above us in all its glory. Here comes a true highlight as we descend Neptune's Staircase, eight perfectly engineered locks that carry us gracefully down to sea level at Corpach. In the afternoon, the adventure shifts to rail as we board the West Highland Railway Line. The train winds through misty glens and across the magnificent Glenfinnan Viaduct, its curve soaring above Loch Shiel, a scene every Harry Potter fan will recognize in an instant.

OCT 8, Thursday CORPACH / TOBERMORY

The day unfolds on tranquil waters as we sail into Loch Linnhe, where Castle Stalker stands proudly on its tiny island—a scene straight out of *Monty Python and the Holy Grail*. Our voyage then winds through the Sound of Mull towards Tobermory, the island's postcard-perfect capital. Its rainbow of Georgian facades greets us warmly, each one adding to the town's storybook charm. The afternoon is yours to explore its cheerful streets, cozy shops, and welcoming cafés at your own pace.

OCT 9, Friday Our journey carries us to Craignure on the Isle of Mull, and from there, across shimmering waters to the sacred Isle of Iona. Known as the cradle of Christianity in Scotland, it was here that St. Columba's mission took root, and generations of kings were laid to rest. Take time to soak in the island's quiet beauty and explore the beautifully restored Benedictine

OCT 10, Saturday

Today we visit Duart Castle, the historic home of Clan Maclean, loyal supporters of the Jacobite cause. Discover its commanding position on a high crag at the end of the peninsula, a location chosen to control the Sound of Mull

Abbey, a timeless symbol of faith and tranquility.

and the channel to the mainland. Finally, we sail to Oban, the 'gateway of the isles'. Enjoy a walking tour of the town and the impressive McCaig's Folly, which dominates the skyline. Tonight, we gather for our dinner onboard.

OCT 11, Sunday DISEMBARK / LOCH LOMOND After breakfast, we disembark in Oban and travel toward the beautiful banks of Loch Lomond. There, we'll board a one-hour cruise across the tranquil waters surrounded by awe-inspiring mountains. Admire sweeping views of Ben Lomond and the stately homes that grace the shoreline. Our journey also takes us to the intriguing Inchmurrin Island, the largest on the loch and once a refuge for Robert the Bruce before he became King of Scotland. Afterwards, we continue to our hotel for the night.

Macdonald Forest Hills Hotel & Spa (2 nights)

Explore the art of whisky making at Glengoyne Distillery. Renowned for its unhurried process, see how this fine single malt Scotch whisky has been crafted since 1833, from slow distillation to careful maturation in hand-selected oak casks. To complete the experience, we enjoy a tasting of their rich, complex whiskies. This afternoon, prepare for an exhilarating 4x4 adventure into the rugged hills above Loch Lomond. Led by passionate, kilted guides, we board powerful Land Rover Defenders to navigate challenging off-road terrain, pausing at scenic stops for stunning views. Back at our hotel we shall

OCT 13, Tuesday

Our day in Glasgow begins at the Glasgow Cathedral.

Explore its sacred crypt, the pristine Blackadder Aisle, and see its extraordinary stained glass windows. Following our visit, a panoramic tour introduces you to more of the city.

visit, a panoramic tour introduces you to more of the city. Drive by the Victorian Necropolis, a fascinating hillside cemetery, and continue to George Square, the grand civic centre. The tour also highlights the University of Glasgow, founded in the 15th century, where you can see the historic cloisters that once welcomed scholars like Adam Smith. This afternoon we visit the world-renowned Burrell Collection. This gift from shipping magnate Sir William Burrell features over 8,000 works of art.

OCT 14, Wednesday EDINBURGH

Today is dedicated to Scotland's capital, starting at the iconic Edinburgh Castle. Crowning the city atop a volcanic crag, this breathtaking fortress was once home to Mary Queen of Scots and King James VI. A walking tour of the Old Town takes us to The Vennel for the dramatic castle shots, the Royal Mile, the historic charm of White Horse Close and the opulent Palace of Holyroodhouse. This evening, we travel to the historic town of Linlithgow for a special farewell dinner at Mason Belles Kitchen, a charming, family-run restaurant celebrated for its creative, locally inspired Scottish cuisine.

OCT 15. Thursday EDINBURGH / CANADA

All too soon, our Scottish journey comes to an end. Transfer to the Edinburgh Airport for your flight home.

Important Travel Information: U.K. ETA

Starting in late 2026, Canadian citizens travelling to Scotland will need to complete a U.K. Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA). This is not a visa, but a pre-travel security screening required for visa-exempt visitors entering. The cost is about £16 and is each traveller's responsibility. For details and to apply, visit the official ETA website well before departure (www.gov.uk/eta).

CT Rating 3/5 - Challenging: This journey involves a moderate amount of walking, often over varied terrain such as the cobblestone streets found in Europe's historic cities. On board and during shore excursions, you may need to navigate stairs and occasional steep steps. To fully enjoy all that this tour has to offer, participants should be in good physical condition and comfortable walking for up to a few kilometres, sometimes on uneven surfaces. Some activities will include 4x4 rides over rough country roads.
